MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

**Between
Somerset Community College
and
Eastern Kentucky University**

Agreement Facilitating Transfer through 2+2 Programs

Somerset Community College and Eastern Kentucky University, in order to contribute to the development of a seamless postsecondary education system for the citizens of Kentucky and to promote the transfer of credits between two institutions while increasing the educational opportunities for students in the institutions' service areas, establish 2+2 agreements contained herein as Exhibits or made in the future and added as Exhibits:

1. It is mutually agreed by Eastern Kentucky University of Richmond, Kentucky (EKU), and Somerset Community College of Somerset, KY (SCC), that ECU will accept on a "2+2" basis transfer credit from SCC for degree holders as described in the attached Exhibits.
2. Upon successful completion of an associate's degree program designated in the attached Exhibits, Somerset Community College graduates will be eligible for admission to the appropriate ECU degree program based on successfully meeting ECU's admission requirements and academic policies.
3. Successful completion of an associate's degree program at SCC is defined by the requirements of that program at the time the degree is conferred.
4. Upon admission, ECU will transfer all credit hours earned at Somerset Community College with a "C" grade or better into the ECU degree program specified in an attached Exhibit and will allocate specific credit as appropriate under current ECU transfer policies to meet core and/or specialization requirements, General Education requirements (as articulated in CPE's General Education Transfer Policy), University requirements, College requirements, and/or electives.
5. The allocation of advanced credit to the degree program will be the responsibility of the applicable ECU program advisor, subject to the approval of the applicable College Dean.
6. SCC will retain full responsibility for the general education program of its students. Furthermore, SCC is expected to inform ECU of any applicable change(s) in the

curriculum or change(s) in the availability of learning opportunities as far in advance of the change(s) as feasible. Failure to do so may prevent articulation of transfer credits.

7. The faculty and staff of both institutions are encouraged to contact and/or visit each institution to plan, survey, observe, and/or participate in conferences with students, administrators, staff, and/or faculty.
8. SCC and EKU will work together to design and implement a cooperative advising system to ensure that students participating or seeking to participate in the program receive accurate and timely information regarding the program.
9. SCC will provide to EKU's Office of the Registrar upon request free transcripts of program participants to facilitate accurate and timely advising, consistent with all FERPA and other applicable requirements regarding student records.
10. As part of the program, any SCC student participating in the program will be permitted to enroll concurrently as guest student(s) at EKU to complete courses required for the program. Such enrollment is subject to availability of courses and seats and subject to any prerequisites or other requirements set forth in each institution's academic catalog.
11. SCC and EKU will work together to design and disseminate promotional materials, news releases, and informative brochures for the mutual benefit of both institutions.
12. This agreement, including attached Exhibits or other documents referenced therein, will be reviewed every three years by one or more representatives from each institution, as designated in the attached Exhibit(s). As needed, the designated representatives will update promptly the attached Exhibit(s) regarding program requirements and curriculum to reflect any changes.
13. This Memorandum of Agreement may be terminated by either party upon written notice to the other party six (6) calendar months prior to the desired effective date of termination. Both institutions agree to make special arrangements as needed to provide any student(s) currently enrolled in the program at the time of written notice of termination the opportunity to complete the program in a timely manner.
14. This Memorandum of Agreement will be in effect unless terminated as described above.
