Are you interested in hair design, hair coloring, skin care, and makeup artistry. Do you enjoy “hands on” training? Then this is the program for you.

The Cosmetology program at Somerset Community College offers comprehensive training in the study and application of beauty treatment. We offer students the technical skills and valuable life lessons that enable them to be

successful in a fast-paced, consumer-driven industry.

Students in the program are required to receive at least 1,800 hours of instruction. The program incorporates individual instruction with group learning activities. Students attend theory classes and participate in hands-on training in the laboratory SCC’s Cosmetology program also has a loyal clientele of customers who give students ample opportunity to practice and perfect the skills needed for an exciting career.

WHAT CAN I DO WITH THIS PROGRAM?

Upon successful completion of the prescribed program, the graduate is prepared to take the Apprentice Cosmetology Examination. After successfully passing the practical and written Kentucky state board exams, the student is a licensed apprentice cosmetologist. Licensed apprentice cosmetologist must serve a six-month apprenticeship under the direct supervision of a licensed cosmetologist.

JOB OUTLOOK

Overall employment for cosmetologists and other personal appearance workers is projected to grow much faster than the average for all occupations through 2018, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

COSMETOLOGY QUICK FACTS

1. Cosmetologist, 1500 clock hours - Certificate or Diploma.
2. Nail Technician, 450 Clock Hours - Certificate.
3. Esthetician, 750 Clock Hours - Certificate.
4. Instructor, 750 Clock hours beyond Certificate.
5. Cosmetology - 48 credit hour program.
6. Evening classes available.
7. Two Cosmetology Tracks to choose:
4 full semesters) 12, 12, 12, and 12 credit hours or
3 semesters and a biterm) 14, 14, 14, and 6 credit hours
8. Students can perform services on the public after 250 clock hours.
9. Nail technology and Esthetics fall under the Cosmetology Certificate but can also be standalone certificates.
10. Student teacher ratio is 20 to 1.
11. Students provide services to the public two days a week in a salon setting.
12. All three of thae Cosmetology departments combined can take up to 140 students a semester (if there's faculty to support them).
13. The Cosmetology departments are involved with community service projects (operation kids Christmas, Bethany House), campus activities (Earth Day, Monster Bash, International Festival), and volunteer services for the local county schools for their "Positive Image" group.
